

PERFORMANCE + OBJECT Webster's Spanish-English dictionary Pica

Pica: a behavior beyond accepted cultural traditions, consisting of constant (i.e. for more than one month) ingestion of inedible substances, which are inappropriate for that developmental stage or age (American Psychiatric Association, 1994 DMS IV).

*Pica* is an ongoing performance the artist began back in 2009 a few weeks after arriving to the U.S. Every day she sits down in front of her English/Spanish dictionary and selects an English word; then, she cuts it and eats it.

In a very intimate gesture, through the repetition of the same act in time, she committed to swallowing the entire dictionary and to digest the implications of being a native Spanish-speaker in the U.S. Therefore, she not only attempts to embody the English language and to remove its artificiality and foreignness, but to ironically follow the lessons from Oswald de Andrade's *Manifesto Antropófago*, in which he states that the best way to absorb the disparate, uneven, chaotic, and voluptuous reality of another culture is not to imitate or resist it "but to eagerly absorb, to eat, to swallow it whole".
